Scores must be less than 5 years old at time of admissions. Photo copies will not be accepted for admissions purposes.



TOEFL/IELTS Scores	International applicants only: Our department accepts both the TOEFL (Testing of English as a Foreign Language) and the IELTS (International English Language Testing Service). Scores must be sent directly to University of Utah International Admissions Office. For the TOEFL you will need to use code <u>4853</u> . Please allow 2 months for scoring, transmitting, and processing. Statement of Purpose	 All applicants are required to upload a Statement of Purpose that may address the following: Your desired degree program (MS-thesis, MS-non- thesis, MS/MBA or Ph.D.) The specialization area for your graduate work A list of possible research topics The advisor for your graduate work (if known) or possible advisors in the department A discussion of why you wish to pursue graduate education Your career plans following the completion of the graduate degree program 	 Tips on Statement of Purpose: Submit approximately 1 full-page of writing. Your Statement of Purpose is an opportunity for you to highlight who you are, your previous accomplishments/research and your future goals. Prior to submission, be sure to proof read your personal statement for punctuation and grammatical errors. Sample guidelines for a statement of purpose can be found at career services - personal statements.
Writing Sample- Essay-Publication	Submission of a writing sample is optional . Applicants may upload a writing sample of a previous research article or a critical review of a contemporary/scholarly journal article.	 Note: Applicants are encouraged to submit their highest quality of previous work. Scholarly journals should relate to mechanical engineering or an allied field.



Letters of Recommendation	Submit 3 letters of recommendations from professors, employers, or others who can knowingly comment on their background as it relates to graduate education and research. Applicants must submit their 3 recommenders electronically via the Recommendation link in the online <u>Apply Yourself</u> application.	 Note: Only contact information for each reference is necessary; recommenders will be sent a form via email that they will submit electronically.
Application Fee	 A non-refundable application fee is required: \$55 for all Domestic Applicants \$65 for all International Applicants 	 Note: We are not able to waive this fee. The application will not be complete until this payment has been received. Fee must be paid via check, debit or credit card prior to submitting your application. Late applications are subject to an additional fee of \$30.

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
